9-1-1 Report to Commissioners, 7/1/2024

- Regarding recording vendor – we have 2 separate quotes for Eventide from 2 different resellers. Reseller 1 (\$43K quote) has cautioned us about service from Reseller 2 (\$35 K quote). Reseller one is examining their quote to see if they can bring it in line with Reseller 2. I will be checking some references for both resellers before finalizing recommendation. I had hoped to have this recommendation for approval today.
- Sheriff and I went to Columbiana County Sheriff’s office to observe Sundance CAD in action. It appears to fit our needs and has a much lower upfront price and similar annual cost as other quote. Will reach out for updated quote this week.
- Continue to work diligently to resolve MSAG (Master Street Address Guide) deficiencies. These are addressing errors that prevent NG9-1-1 from properly mapping addresses. This is fairly intensive work but is vital for proper operation of the system.

I have found issues with addressing between the Engineer’s GIS (authoritative addresses) and Auditor’s information. There was a recent EMS run where the resident gave an address that was improper, would not map, and actually would have been over 2 miles from the actual location.

Roger Calendine, Morgan-Meigsville Water Board

-Mr. Calendine got an email today from their lawyer, and he's on the finishing touches of checking out easements. They should have that done this week. Their engineer says that he just

needs a day or so to finalize the bid, and then we'll be bidding in the next few days for the project on 60 North.

They finally got through with ODOT concerning easements. They ended up on ODOT right away on a lot of it. Otherwise, the project would be something they can't do.

They are not sure exactly when the lawyer's going to be done with his certification of all the easements, but he's in the final paperwork of that, so there're guessing it'll be done this week.

Chastity, Buckeye Hills

-Gave 2023 report *See Attachment A

-The actual breakdown of what funding came under the different programs and what that return on investment is. Commissioners' dues to Buckeye Hills are \$3,036.44 a year. If you look at it per dollar, it's \$837.96 per capita, \$186.46 per person. Then there's all the programming that gets served. Everything from senior citizens, to planning grants, and transportation awards. The map shows where those projects occur. A lot of them right around Malta-McConnelsville, not unusual given that that's a population. Also, there are some in the Chester Hill area as well, including water system improvements, \$2.2 million from ARC.

Shannon Wells. Development Office

-DLZ Engineering has prepared the bid specs for Embree Park Improvements & Chesterhill Park Improvements and need approved for advertising.

-Zanesville Law is to have the title searches for all easements completed today and signed off on for the next step for the water project on SR60N.

-Morgan County Transit has started provided public transportation service in Noble County officially as of July 1, 2024.

-A meeting of the Morgan County Land Bank Reutilization Corporation is Wednesday at 9am in the Morgan County Economic Development conference room.

-The Ohio Capital Budget FY25-26 Funding Announcement was made last week. The Morgan County Emergency Communications Center was awarded \$250,000.00 and the Morgan County Jail Improvement Project was awarded \$300,000.00.

-Specs at for Embrey Park and for Chester Hill Park. DLG has put together. These are the streetscapes. This is the park...with our CDBG funds from 2023 that were allocated. Paving the parking lot of the community center, doing a path down to the walking path, and then doing the walking path in Chester Hill Park. It was like \$97,000.

Caleb Shriver, Representative for Senator J.D Vance

-The railway safety bill is what the office has been working on the most as of recent, trying to get that passed through the Senate. This came after the East Palestine Railway crash. And basically, it just adds in a couple more regulations and higher fines for unsafe railways, so detectors, at least two-person crew, and higher fines. Also working on removing the penalty for people withdrawing in Social Security who work in the public sector. When someone works for the private sector and then moves over to the public sector and retires and they try to get their Social Security, they get penalized for it. That's also something that the office has been looking into and trying to get some legislation through to...Those are two major things. The election coming up, we're busy with that. This is mainly what we've been working on.

Amber Wilson, Senior Citizen Director

Jeff Babcock, IT Administrator

The IT Director attended the Zanesville – Muskingum Chamber of Commerce Safety Council meeting in Zanesville this week. The topic of discussion was human trafficking presented by the Muskingum County Prosecutor's Office. This was the last meeting of the BWC fiscal year.

The computers from the Learning Center at the Public Transit building were moved to

the Ohio Means Jobs office at the Riecker Building. About half of the computers being moved were placed online, the other half were stored in the OMJ office. Unfortunately, many of the computers now have an issue with Microsoft Office in that Microsoft wants a separate license key for all users on the computer. Troubleshooting is ongoing.

The Secretary of State's latest security directive to the Board of Elections – directive 2024-10 – was reviewed. This directive only has a couple of new requirements for local Boards of Elections. The first is that they will be getting their own MARCS radio. To that end, a technician traced out an old antenna cable on the roof and will reuse that to install an external antenna for the new BOE MARCS radio. The second new requirement is that cameras and camera systems must be on their own VLAN on the BOE network. This does not apply to the Morgan County BOE as the cameras in their office are connected to the Riecker Building network.

The Engineer's office's website hosting is due for renewal and they are wanting to change the format they use for their website. They are looking at going to a Wordpress or other CMS-based website that will allow for easier updating. Unfortunately, GoDaddy, the current host, has shut off several pages on their site. The Engineer's office will work with their vendor to renew the current service on a month-by-month basis until the Wordpress site is ready to go online.

The IT Director asked the Commissioners about the security cameras in the first floor hallway of the Riecker Building. In order for the cameras to be effective in that hallway, they will need to be mounted low on the wall. If they are mounted too high, they will only capture the tops of the large glass globe lights in the hallway. If they are mounted too low, the concern is that they can be vandalized. The Commissioners decided that the cameras should be placed in the individual offices on the first floor instead.

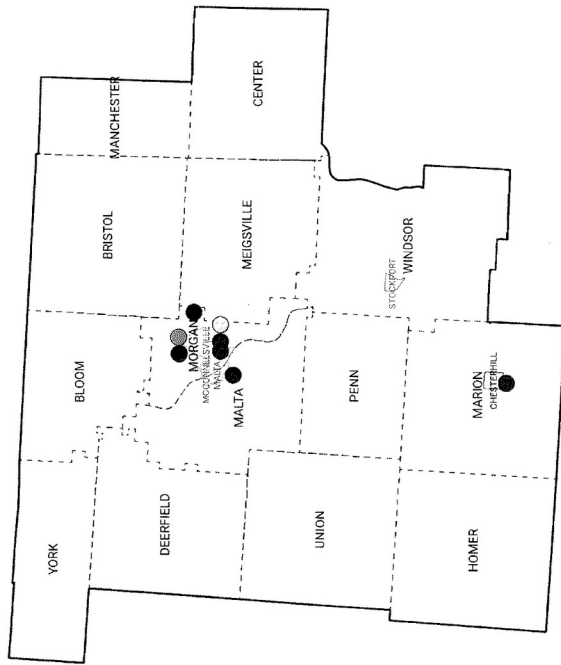

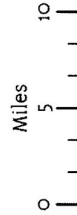
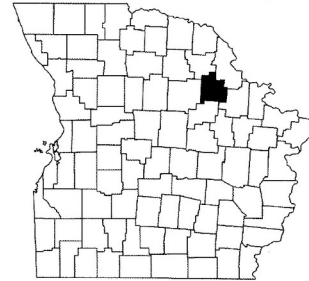
